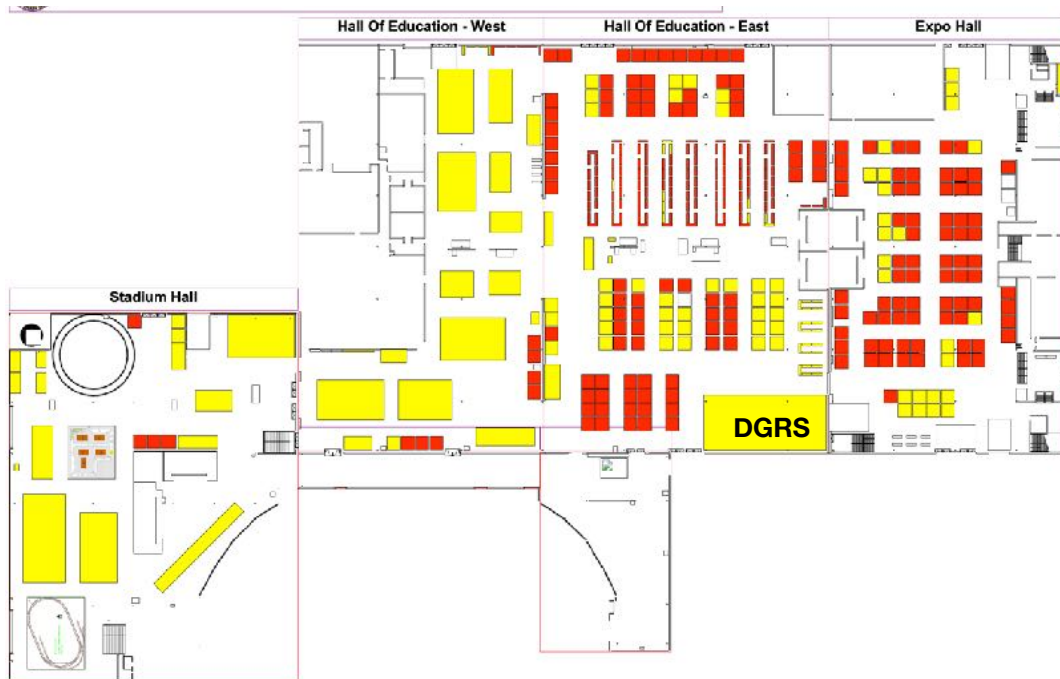

MUSEUM HAPPENINGS

Activities at the Museum

Repairs are being made to the DGRS California Zephyr Locomotives.

Sam Kunugi found out that the power truck frames on the USA Trains locomotives that DGRS uses to pull our version of the California Zephyr were causing the axel bearings, stubs and gear shafts to wear and mis-align resulting in the axel



mounted gears wearing sooner than they should. USA Trains sell both of these parts and several new parts have already been changed out. The new frames come with new axle stub bearings and springs.

Examination of all of the frames indicated that more frames will need to be replaced soon along with some electrical work.

At this point we have a set of smooth running A and B units. These can be used to pull only 3 Zephyr passenger cars for now. When more locomotives are repaired, longer Zephyr trains can be pulled.

Al Blount, Marilou and Pete Hendel replaced the light fixtures in the Alpine Tunnel building. Let their be light!!! The work benches along the railings need to be replaced/fixed so that a usable work surface can be used. We are looking into alternatives that will provide a reliable all-season surface to put your equipment and trains on. Suggestions are welcome.

We will need to start some spring ground keeping real soon. Ground keeping will start with the leaf filled pond and water feature.

We are hoping that we don't have to delay these projects like last year when we had so many rain delays!

Saturday work sessions need to be carefully tailored to make sure that we can still run trains for visitors. Weeding, fence repair, rolling stock cleaning are some examples.

The Bunny Train! March 30. Please bring your bunny trains to show the kids.

Remember that **Rail Days are on April 25th and 26.** Steamers #20 and #491 fire up to pull trains around the CRRM loop. Several display locomotives and cars are open for visitors to climb into including steam engines, diesels and cabooses. A working hand pumped track maintenance car is in action and the turntable will moving around.

- September 14/15 tours are in the Southwest quadrant, South of Colfax and East of Santa Fe.

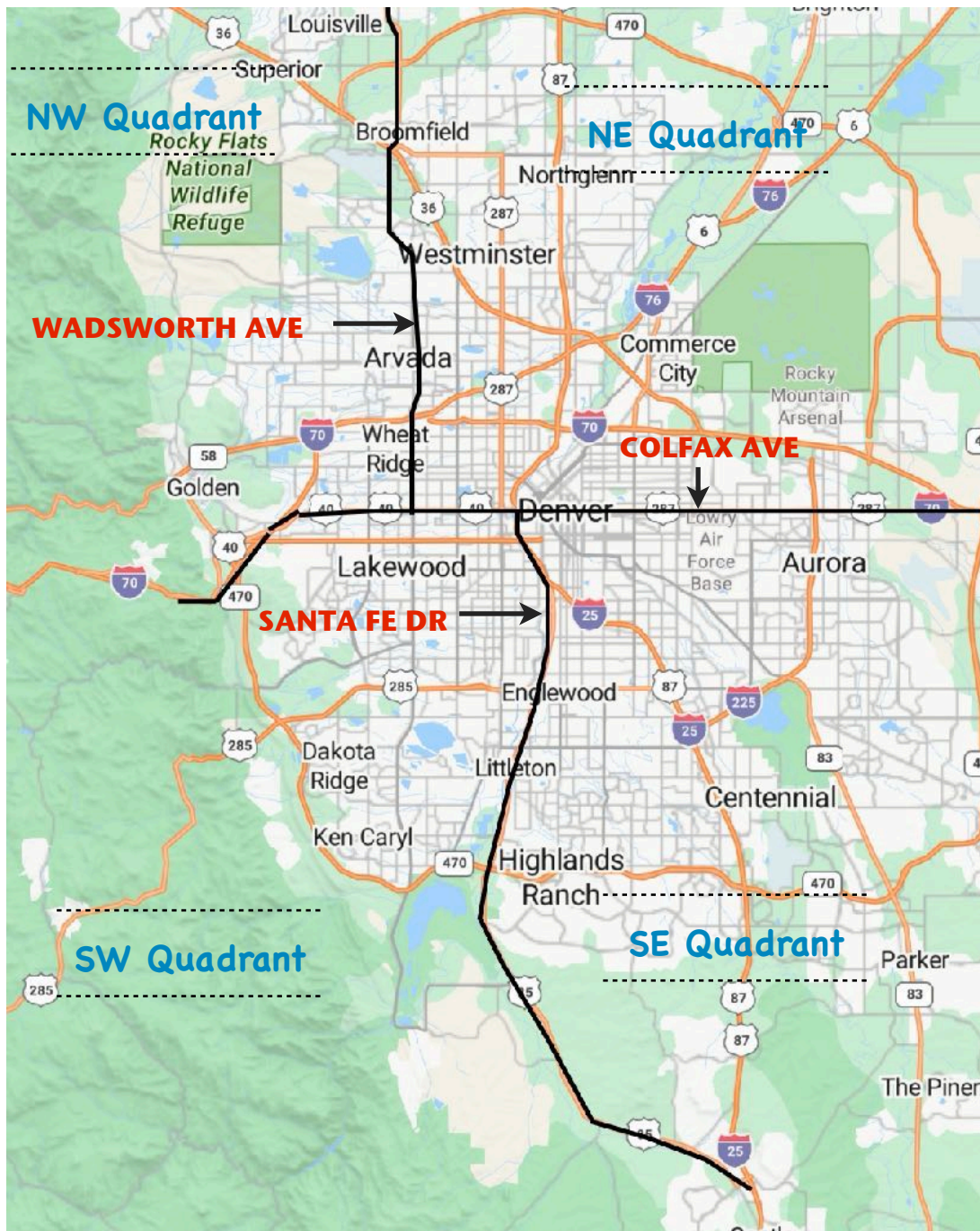
As always, you can run on other dates. You might have a lower attendance than if you were in your quadrant. You can run multiple days or any day you want, just tell me and I will get the word out.

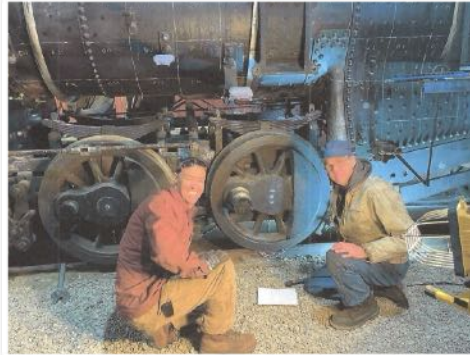
