


The Outreach Committee is also eager to hear any ideas club members might have as to school or community events that DGRS could travel to. Please let us know of these, and we'll do our best to make it work!





UPDATE: 2024 Southeast Regional G Scale Get Together August 23-25

Since 1985 there has been a G-scale National Convention hosted by different G-scale Clubs around the country. Unfortunately, nothing was bid for the 2024 convention. So, G-scale societies and clubs around the country are hosting regional events. The Georgia Garden Railway Society (GGRS) has stepped forward and elected to host a **G-Scale Southeast Regional Get-Together** that will feature:

- Up to 10 different self-guided metro-Atlanta area garden railway tours daily on Friday, August 23rd, and Sunday, August 25th;
- Some out-of-area garden railway tours off selected major Interstates may open on Thursday, August 22nd for those coming in early if sufficient interest;
- Tours of the warehouse facility for nationally known model train retailer TRAINZ on Friday, August 23rd;
- An enhanced G-scale vendor presence at the **65th Atlanta Model Train Show** in Duluth, Georgia, on Saturday, August 24th, including a multi-table White Elephant Sale by GGRS members; and, G-scale oriented "how-to" clinics. Confirmed vendors include TRAINZ, Split-Jaw, melovetrainz, and other well know vendors.

We have **discounted hotel rooms** Thursday, August 23 through Sunday, August 25th (4 nights) at the Embassy Suites by Hilton, Atlanta NE/Gwinnet Sugarloaf, 2029 Satellite Blvd Duluth, GA 30097 - book using this link <u>https://www.hilton.com/en/attend-my-event/atlaees-ggr-954b4189-ffc5-4636-b2a1-f85cef2c263f/</u> If rooms are sold out please contact Pam Williamson 770-851-9462 via text, and we will see if we can add more rooms.

A **Dinner Get-Together on Friday night** will be a picnic buffet at the nearby Gwinnett County Bethesda Park Senior Center from 5:30 to 8:00 p.m. and will feature door prizes, raffles, area shopping and train venues information, and more. There is no entrance or parking fee at the dinner site.

The 2024 Southeast Region **Get-Together Car** is a USA Trains 40' steel box car with metal wheels. The lettering is a combination of a USA Trains 40 foot American Series box car, a USA Trains 50' Ultimate Series box car with a discrete 2024 Regional logo. The Regional Car will be offered with 4 road numbers 103803, 103804, 103805, 103806. Twenty-five of each road number will be ordered, first come first serve. Please specify if you want a particular road number.

The Registration Bag will include driving instructions and a schedule of garden railroad tours hosted by members of the Georgia Garden Railway Society (9:00-4:00 Friday and Sunday), a \$1 discount coupon for each family member toward admission to the 65th Atlanta Model Train Show on August 24th (parking is a separate fee), get-together pin(1 for individual registration and 2 for a family registration), driving instructions and passes you may



have purchased to the Friday evening get-together dinner, a get-together car or cars if ordered, a list of G-scale vendors at the train show, and other useful information. **Registration Bag can be picked up Thursday** evening or Friday morning at the event hotel.

The cost of registration is \$25.00 per an individual registration and \$35.00 per family (up to two adults and two children) for registration prior to **JUNE 1, 2024**. Late registration, **after JUNE 1**, will increase to \$40.00 per individual and \$50.00 per family registration. **A registration form can be found at www.ggrs.info**, please print the registration form and mail it along with your check to the address on the form. Be sure to include fees for the Friday night meal, train show car(s), and early email of tour booklet if you desire any of these extras. Remember, the meal and the cars are limited in number, so register and order early!

Union Pacific Steam Club Update No. 32 - Apr. 10, 2024



Big Boy No. 4014's Westward Bound Tour Coming this Summer!

Union Pacific's famed Big Boy No. 4014, the world's largest operating steam locomotive, will return to the rails this summer with a scenic tour across mountain ranges and high desert vistas in four western states: Wyoming, Utah, Nevada and California.

Big Boy will journey from its home base in Cheyenne, Wyoming on **Sunday, June 30**, en route to Roseville, California, before returning to Wyoming by the end of July. It will make numerous whistle-stops in communities along the way, with public display stops scheduled in:

- July 12-13: Roseville, California
- July 20-21: Ogden, Utah


Additional route details and approximate times for whistle stops will be shared closer to the tour. A <u>route map</u> can be found on <u>UPsteam.com</u>.

During the tour, the <u>Union Pacific Museum</u> will host a special passenger trip. The unique experience is the annual gala fundraiser for the nonprofit organization and provides a rare opportunity to travel on this historic heritage equipment. More information on the specifics will appear at <u>www.UPtrainTix.com</u> when they become available.

This is one of two public tours planned for Big Boy in 2024, with a second tour planned later this fall with stops in Texas, Arkansas, Kansas, and Illinois, among other states. Details of the second tour will be released later this spring.

The month-long "Westward Bound" tour will honor Union Pacific's rich railroad legacy and celebrate the railroad's employees and communities it serves. For part of its journey, the Big Boy's consist will include an assortment of rail cars giving spectators a glimpse into what the locomotive looked like pulling freight in its heyday.

"The Big Boy locomotive symbolizes the pivotal role railroads played in shaping our nation's history, and the technological advances we have witnessed within our industry," said Union Pacific CEO Jim Vena. "We are thrilled to share this living piece of history with our employees and the public, and we love seeing the enthusiasm this locomotive generates wherever its whistle blows."

Model Inventory

A couple of years ago I came across an App on the APP store called Model Inventory from Woodland Scenics it's a free App from Apple and also available on Google play. It is for Phones and Tablets only.

It's a cloud based App so you can have a copy of your Model Inventory in the cloud. I use it to keep track of all my model trains and my die cast. You can make your own categories. I have it on my phone and it works great when I go to a train show or hobby shop to see if I have that road number. Although this article and ad is about an HO gauge version, it could be built in G scale, maybe with lights, whistle or horn.

This could be an idea to use at the museum to test new people running trains. The ball is a scale 76" diameter, so that would be approximately 3.0" diameter. It would have to be conductive so the ball can complete the circuit. Another solution would to use photocells or ?????......

Sounds like a project for Byron or maybe a new member!!!!

At last! A practical model railroad kit designed to help modelers test and improve their operations skills. The model has a scale 76" diameter steel ball riding on a section of track inside the car. The ball obeys all of Newton's laws of gravity and will give a modeler a visual record of the quality of his trackwork, power pack control, and operating prowess. (Don't forget that on real railroads if cars are coupled at a speed greater than 4mph, the result is often loss and damage!) Start or stop a train too fast and a light on top of the car turns on. The sides of the car are clear plastic with a silk-screen scale to show how for the falls rolls.

It all adds up to a challenge and a chance for modelers to try their operating skills. Truly, it is a real, working "Impact Test Car".




